RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. 





Confession of Faith (The Athanasian Creed)

- *I* Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.
- 2 Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally.
- 3 And the catholic faith is this,
- 4 that we worship one God in trinity and Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.
- 5 For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another.
- 6 But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.
- 7 Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit:
- 8 the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;
- 9 the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;
- 10 the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.
- 11 And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal,
- 12 just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites, but one Uncreated and one Infinite.
- 13 In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;
- 14 and yet there are not three Almighties but one Almighty.
- 15 So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;
- 16 and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.
- 17 So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;
- 18 and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.
- 19 Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord,
- 20 so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.
- 21 The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone. The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone.
- 22 The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten but proceeding.
- 23 Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.
- 24 And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another;
- 25 but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other so that in all things, as has been stated above, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.
- 26 Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.
- 27 But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 28 Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man.
- 29 He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:
- 30 perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh;
- 31 equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity.
- 32 Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ:
- one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh but by the assumption of the humanity into God;
- 34 one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.
- 35 For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ,
- 36 who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again from the dead,
- 37 ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
- 38 At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds.
- 39 And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire.
- 40 This is the catholic faith; whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved.



Readings for the Festival of the Holy Trinity

The Old Testament Reading is Genesis 1:1-2:4a

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

And God said, "Let there be an expanse in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." And God made the expanse and separated the waters that were under the expanse from the waters that were above the expanse. And it was so. And God called the expanse Heaven. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

And God said, "Let the waters under the heavens be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good.

And God said, "Let the earth sprout vegetation, plants yielding seed, and fruit trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind, on the earth." And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed according to their own kinds, and trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night. And let them be for signs and for seasons, and for days and years, and let them be lights in the expanse of the heavens to give light upon the earth." And it was so. And God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. And God set them in the expanse of the heavens to give light on the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

And God said, "Let the waters swarm with swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the heavens." So God created the great sea creatures and every living creature that moves, with which the waters swarm, according to their kinds, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it

was good. And God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth." And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day.

And God said, "Let the earth bring forth living creatures according to their kinds—livestock and creeping things and beasts of the earth according to their kinds." And it was so. And God made the beasts of the earth according to their kinds and the livestock according to their kinds, and everything that creeps on the ground according to its kind. And God saw that it was good.

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth."

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth." And God said, "Behold, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit. You shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth and to every bird of the heavens and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food." And it was so. And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done in creation.

These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created.

The Second Reading is Acts 2:14a, 22-36

Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, ...

"Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know— this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. For David says concerning him, "'I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken; therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; my flesh also will dwell in hope. For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One see corruption. You have made known to me the paths of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence.'

"Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says, "'The Lord said to my Lord, Sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool.' Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

The Gospel is Matthew 28:16-20

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."



About How Christ's Power Empowers His Church

By "going to the Father" Christ means that He is to be made Lord and placed on the royal chair at the right hand of the Father, that all power and might in heaven and on earth are given to Him, as He says in Matt. 28:18. "You will get the power to perform such works because you are My members and believe in Me; because you will be in Me, and I will be in you. For through the power which, coequal in majesty and publicly glorified as true God and Lord over all creatures, I shall enjoy at the right hand of the Father I will work in you who believe in Me and who have My Word, Baptism, and Sacrament, and remain faithful to these. And just as I am Lord over sin, death, hell, the devil, the world, and everything, so you shall also be lords over these and be able to glory in the same power. This is yours, not by reason of your own worthiness or strength but solely because I am going to the Father.

"And I am going to the Father for the purpose of initiating and fulfilling this. For now, while I still sojourn here on earth in this flesh, I am weak and performing only small and slight works, such as raising a few people from the dead or helping a handful of Jews. And now I must let Myself be crucified and put to death. But afterwards — after My crucifixion, death, and burial — I shall first leap from death into life, from the cross and the grave into everlasting glory, divine majesty, and might. Then ... I will draw all men to Myself, and all creatures will have to be subject to Me. Then I shall be able to say to you apostles and Christians: 'You, Peter or Paul, you must go forth and overthrow the Roman Empire if it refuses to obey My Word.' Thus it will become apparent that you are doing far greater works than I am now doing. ... "

The Minnesota legislature approved an Omnibus health bill that repeals a bipartisan measure protecting newborns and a bipartisan program supporting pregnant women who want to carry their babies to term. It also rescinds a number of longstanding laws surrounding abortion. Gov. Tim Walz signed the wide-ranging bill, which the House and Senate passed into law along narrow party lines, into law. "First Gov. Walz and DFL majorities enacted abortion-up-to-birth, a policy at odds with the vast majority of the world," said MCCL Co-Executive Director Cathy Blaeser. "Now, somehow, they have gone even further. They have revoked a law that requires lifesaving care for newborns. And they have wiped the Positive Alternatives program that supports pregnant women in difficult circumstances. Babies and women are both harmed by this sweeping extremism." The Omnibus bill, SF 2995, was largely crafted behind closed doors without input from Republicans on the conference committee. The bill strips out Minnesota's existing requirement that reasonable measures be taken to "preserve the life and health" of bornalive infants, replacing it with a requirement for "care," which the bill's House author, Rep. Tina Liebling (DFL-Rochester), has described as mere "comfort" care. Under the new language, an infant could be denied lifesaving care and allowed to die. Disabled babies, whose lives are often devalued, could be especially at risk from the denial of this basic protection. (LifeNews.com, 5/22/23)


