RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation:
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. The liturgy for the first day of Holy Week is in two parts. It begins with a procession with palms as a dramatic prelude to the Eucharist; this memorable ceremony gives the nickname "Palm Sunday" to the day. The service itself is a celebration of the Passion of Jesus Christ, a highlight of which is the reading (or singing) of a passion account from one of the Gospels. As a prelude to the reading of the passion, the procession with palms provides of an appropriate outburst of joy which does not lose sight of the solemn goal of Jesus' triumphal entry. He rides on to die. The somberness of the passion, which is the focus of Holy Week, is thus framed by the joy of the preparatory procession and by the greater joy of Easter which is its purpose and culmination.



A Reading from the Evangelist, St. John, the Twelfth Chapter.

The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."

The Passion of Our Lord according to St. Matthew Chapters 26–27 English Standard Version

1. The Plot against Jesus and Jesus Anointed at Bethany (26:1–16)

EVANGELIST: When Jesus had finished all these sayings, he said to his disciples,

Jesus: You know that after two days the Passover is coming, and the Son of Man will be delivered up to be crucified.

EVANGELIST: Then the chief priests and the elders of the people gathered in the palace of the high priest, whose name was Caiaphas, and plotted together in order to arrest Jesus by stealth and kill him. But they said,

Chief Priests: Not during the feast, lest there be an uproar among the people.

EVANGELIST: Now when Jesus was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, a woman came up to him with an alabaster flask of very expensive ointment, and she poured it on his head as he reclined at table. And when the disciples saw it, they were indignant, saying,

Disciples: Why this waste? For this could have been sold for a large sum and given to the poor.

EVANGELIST: But Jesus, aware of this, said to them,

Jesus: Why do you trouble the woman? For she has done a beautiful thing to me. For you always have the poor with you, but you will not always have me. In pouring this ointment on my body, she has done it to prepare me for burial. Truly, I say to you, wherever this gospel is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will also be told in memory of her.

EVANGELIST: Then one of the twelve, whose name was Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests and said,

Judas: What will you give me if I deliver him over to you?

EVANGELIST: And they paid him thirty pieces of silver. And from that moment he sought an opportunity to betray him.

2. Preparation for the Passover and Institution of the Lord's Supper (26:17–29)

Evangelist: Now on the first day of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying,

Disciples: Where will you have us prepare for you to eat the Passover?

EVANGELIST: He said,

Jesus: Go into the city to a certain man and say to him, 'The Teacher says, My time is at hand. I will keep the Passover at your house with my disciples.'

EVANGELIST: And the disciples did as Jesus had directed them, and they prepared the Passover. When it was evening, he reclined at table with the twelve. And as they were eating, he said,

Jesus: Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me.

EVANGELIST: And they were very sorrowful and began to say to him one after another,

Disciples: Is it I, Lord?

EVANGELIST: He answered,

Jesus: He who has dipped his hand in the dish with me will betray me. The Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born.

EVANGELIST: Judas, who would betray him, answered,

Judas: Is it I, Rabbi?

EVANGELIST: He said to him.

Jesus: You have said so.

EVANGELIST: Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said,

Jesus: Take, eat; this is my body.

Evangelist: And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying,

Jesus: Drink of it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you I will not drink again of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom.

EVANGELIST: And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives

3. Prediction of Peter's Denial (26:30–35)

EVANGELIST: Then Jesus said to them,

Jesus: You will all fall away because of me this night. For it is written, 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered.' But after I am raised up, I will go before you to Galilee.

EVANGELIST: Peter answered him,

Peter: Though they all fall away because of you, I will never fall away.

EVANGELIST: Jesus said to him,

Jesus: Truly, I tell you, this very night, before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times.

EVANGELIST: Peter said to him,

Peter: Even if I must die with you, I will not deny you!

EVANGELIST: And all the disciples said the same.

4. Jesus Prays in the Garden of Gethsemane (26:36–46)

EVANGELIST: Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples,

Jesus: Sit here, while I go over there and pray.

EVANGELIST: And taking with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, he began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them,

Jesus: My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with me.

EVANGELIST: And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying,

Jesus: My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will.

EVANGELIST: And he came to the disciples and found them sleeping. And he said to Peter.

Jesus: So, could you not watch with me one hour? Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.

EVANGELIST: Again, for the second time, he went away and prayed,

Jesus: My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, your will be done.

EVANGELIST: And again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. So, leaving them again, he went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words again. Then he came to the disciples and said to them,

Jesus: Sleep and take your rest later on. See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Rise, let us be going; see, my betrayer is at hand.

5. Judas' Betrayal and the Arrest of Jesus (26:47–56)

EVANGELIST: While he was still speaking, Judas came, one of the twelve, and with him a great crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests and the elders

of the people. Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying,

Judas: The one I will kiss is the man; seize him.

EVANGELIST: And he came up to Jesus at once and said,

Judas: Greetings, Rabbi!

EVANGELIST: And he kissed him. Jesus said to him,

Jesus: Friend, do what you came to do.

EVANGELIST: Then they came up and laid hands on Jesus and seized him. And behold, one of those who were with Jesus stretched out his hand and drew his sword and struck the servant of the high priest and cut off his ear. Then Jesus said to him,

Jesus: Put your sword back into its place. For all who take the sword will perish by the sword. Do you think that I cannot appeal to my Father, and he will at once send me more than twelve legions of angels? But how then should the Scriptures be fulfilled, that it must be so?

EVANGELIST: At that hour Jesus said to the crowds,

Jesus: Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs to capture me? Day after day I sat in the temple teaching, and you did not seize me. But all this has taken place that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled.

EVANGELIST: Then all the disciples left him and fled.

6. Jesus before Caiaphas (26:57–68)

Evangelist: Then those who had seized Jesus led him to Caiaphas the high priest, where the scribes and the elders had gathered. And Peter was following him at a distance, as far as the courtyard of the high priest, and going inside he sat with the guards to see the end. Now the chief priests and the whole Council were seeking false testimony against Jesus that they might put him to death, but they found none, though many false witnesses came forward. At last two came forward and said,

False Witnesses: This man said, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God, and to rebuild it in three days.'

EVANGELIST: And the high priest stood up and said,

High Priest: Have you no answer to make? What is it that these men testify against you?

EVANGELIST: But Jesus remained silent. And the high priest said to him,

High Priest: I adjure you by the living God, tell us if you are the Christ, the Son of God.

EVANGELIST: Jesus said to him,

Jesus: You have said so. But I tell you, from now on you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of Power and coming on the clouds of heaven.

EVANGELIST: Then the high priest tore his robes and said,

High Priest: He has uttered blasphemy. What further witnesses do we need? You have now heard his blasphemy. What is your judgment?

EVANGELIST: They answered,

Council: He deserves death.

EVANGELIST: Then they spit in his face and struck him. And some slapped him, saying,

Council: Prophesy to us, you Christ! Who is it that struck you?

7. Peter's Denial (26:69–75)

EVANGELIST: Now Peter was sitting outside in the courtyard. And a servant girl came up to him and said,

Servant Girl: You also were with Jesus the Galilean.

EVANGELIST: But he denied it before them all, saying,

Peter: I do not know what you mean.

EVANGELIST: And when he went out to the entrance, another servant girl saw him, and she said to the bystanders,

Second Servant Girl: This man was with Jesus of Nazareth.

EVANGELIST: And again he denied it with an oath:

Peter: I do not know the man.

EVANGELIST: After a little while the bystanders came up and said to Peter,

Bystander: Certainly you too are one of them, for your accent betrays you.

EVANGELIST: Then he began to invoke a curse on himself and to swear,

Peter: I do not know the man.

EVANGELIST: And immediately the rooster crowed. And Peter remembered the saying of Jesus,

Jesus: Before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times.

EVANGELIST: And he went out and wept bitterly.

8. The Death of Judas and Jesus before Pilate (27:1–14)

EVANGELIST: When morning came, all the chief priests and the elders of the people took counsel against Jesus to put him to death. And they bound him and led him away and delivered him over to Pilate the governor. Then when Judas, his betrayer, saw that Jesus was condemned, he changed his mind and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and the elders, saying,

Judas: I have sinned by betraying innocent blood.

EVANGELIST: They said,

Chief Priests: What is that to us? See to it yourself.

Evangelist: And throwing down the pieces of silver into the temple, he departed, and he went and hanged himself. But the chief priests, taking the pieces of silver, said,

Chief Priests: It is not lawful to put them into the treasury, since it is blood money.

EVANGELIST: So they took counsel and bought with them the potter's field as a burial place for strangers. Therefore that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day. Then was fulfilled what had been spoken by the prophet Jeremiah, saying, "And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of him on whom a price had been set by some of the sons of Israel, and they gave them for the potter's field, as the Lord directed me."

EVANGELIST: Now Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor asked him,

Pilate: Are you the King of the Jews?

Evangelist: Jesus said,

Jesus: You have said so.

EVANGELIST: But when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he gave no answer. Then Pilate said to him,

Pilate: Do you not hear how many things they testify against you?

EvangeList: But he gave him no answer, not even to a single charge, so that the governor was greatly amazed.

9. Pilate Sentences Jesus (27:15-26)

EVANGELIST: Now at the feast the governor was accustomed to release for the crowd any one prisoner whom they wanted. And they had then a notorious prisoner called Barabbas. So when they had gathered, Pilate said to them,

Pilate: Whom do you want me to release for you: Barabbas, or Jesus who is called Christ?

EVANGELIST: For he knew that it was out of envy that they had delivered him up. Besides, while he was sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent word to him,

Pilate's Wife: Have nothing to do with that righteous man, for I have suffered much because of him today in a dream.

EVANGELIST: Now the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowd to ask for Barabbas and destroy Jesus. The governor again said to them,

Pilate: Which of the two do you want me to release for you?

EVANGELIST: And they said,

Crowd: Barabbas.

EVANGELIST: Pilate said to them,

Pilate: Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?

EVANGELIST: They all said,

Crowd: Let him be crucified!

EVANGELIST: And he said,

Pilate: Why, what evil has he done?

EVANGELIST: But they shouted all the more,

Crowd: Let him be crucified!

EVANGELIST: So when Pilate saw that he was gaining nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he took water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying,

Pilate: I am innocent of this man's blood; see to it yourselves.

EVANGELIST: And all the people answered,

Crowd: His blood be on us and on our children!

EVANGELIST: Then he released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, delivered him to be crucified.

10. Jesus Mocked and Crucified (27:27–44)

EVANGELIST: Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the governor's head-quarters, and they gathered the whole battalion before him. And they stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, and twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on his head and put a reed in his right hand. And kneeling before him, they mocked him, saying,

Soldiers: Hail, King of the Jews!

EVANGELIST: And they spit on him and took the reed and struck him on the head. And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the robe and put his own clothes on him and led him away to crucify him. As they went out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name. They compelled this man to carry his cross.

Evangelist: And when they came to a place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull), they offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall, but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. And when they had crucified him, they divided his garments among them by casting lots. Then they sat down and kept watch over him there. And over his head they put the charge against him, which read, "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews." Then two robbers were crucified with him, one on the right and one on the left. And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads and saying,

Bystanders: You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save yourself! If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross.

EVANGELIST: So also the chief priests, with the scribes and elders, mocked him, saying,

Chief Priests: He saved others; he cannot save himself. He is the King of Israel; let him come down now from the cross, and we will believe in him. He trusts in God; let God deliver him now, if he desires him. For he said, 'I am the Son of God.'

Evangelist: And the robbers who were crucified with him also reviled him in the same way.

11. The Death of Jesus (27:45–56)

EVANGELIST: Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying,

Jesus: Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?

Evangelist: that is, My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? And some of the bystanders, hearing it, said,

Bystanders: This man is calling Elijah.

EVANGELIST: And one of them at once ran and took a sponge, filled it with sour wine, and put it on a reed and gave it to him to drink. But the others said,

Bystanders: Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him.

Evangelist: And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit. And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And the earth shook, and the rocks were split. The tombs also were opened. And many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised, and coming out of the tombs after his resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many. When the centurion and those who were with him, keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were filled with awe and said,

Centurion: Truly this was the Son of God!

EVANGELIST: There were also many women there, looking on from a distance, who had followed Jesus from Galilee, ministering to him, among whom were Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joseph and the mother of the sons of Zebedee.

12. Jesus' Burial and a Guard Posted (27:57–66)

EvangeList: When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who also was a disciple of Jesus. He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. And Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen shroud and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had cut in the rock. And he rolled a great stone to the entrance of the tomb and went away. Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were there, sitting opposite the tomb. Next day, that is, after the day of Preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered before Pilate and said,

Chief Priests: Sir, we remember how that impostor said, while he was still alive, 'After three days I will rise.' Therefore order the tomb to be made secure until the third day, lest his disciples go and steal him away and tell the people, 'He has risen from the dead,' and the last fraud will be worse than the first.

EVANGELIST: Pilate said to them,

Pilate: You have a guard of soldiers. Go, make it as secure as you can.

EVANGELIST: So they went and made the tomb secure by sealing the stone and setting a guard.

This [account is preached each year] so that we might learn the difference between Christ's kingdom and the kingdoms of the world, between our Christ-King and other earthly kings. ...

- 7. Here, then, is the difference between this King and worldly rulers: They are concerned about people managing house and home, governing lands and subjects, acquiring money and property, becoming rich and powerful—all for the present time. 


