
RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

- who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;


(d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. The Congregation rises, turns towards the entrance of the nave, and faces the Cross of Christ, the reminder of Christ's promise to come and dwell among His people as they are gathered in His name.

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Readings for the Feast of Pentecost

The Old Testament Reading is Numbers 11:24-30

Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD. And he gathered seventy men of the elders of the people and placed them around the tent. Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. And as soon as the Spirit rested on them, they prophesied. But they did not continue doing it.

Now two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the Spirit rested on them. They were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. And a young man ran and told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp." And Joshua the son of Nun, the assistant of Moses from his youth, said, "My lord Moses, stop them." But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the LORD's people were prophets, that the LORD would put his Spirit on them!" And Moses and the elders of Israel returned to the camp.

The Second Reading is Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them: "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. For these people are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel:

"And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day. And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of

the Lord shall be saved "

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me, and let him who believes in me drink.* As the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Word of God, Living Water from Christ

Christ means to say that His ministry of preaching is a refreshing stream of life. This is not apparent, for it is a simple process. You need only hear it, read it, and preach it. I hear only the weak tone of a voice; I see only a poor letter of the alphabet in the book; I have the thought in my heart. But this same Word that is preached will exert such a secret power that it will flush throngs of devils out of the heart, the realm where the devil rules so mightily, just as the Elbe carries refuse downstream. He calls the Word of God a stream advisedly, for it performs many great acts. It rushes along like a torrent. Such is the effect of Peter's message on Pentecost (Acts 2:41), when with one sermon he drives and washes, as with a stream, approximately 3,000 people from the devil's realm. In one hour he delivered them from death, sin, and devil. That is not apparent, but the Word does have this great power. The stream revived them and brought them to Christ. ...

Mark this verse well against the Anabaptists and the schismatic spirits, or against any blasphemers of the oral Word, who contend that the Spirit and faith are internal, and that therefore everything must be wrought by the spiritual Word. They say that if God does not comfort directly, then the external Word is nothing. This is what the pope also claimed. They want to close our ears to the physical voice or the external Word, and they declare that a sermon is only a feeble sound from the pulpit, just as they also say that Baptism is only plain water, and that the Lord's Supper contains only simple bread and wine. But what does the Lord Christ say here? He declares: "He who believes in Me, comes to Me, and drinks of Me, out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water."



Encouragement Found in Scriptures:

But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

-Matthew 6:33



"FINALLY, BE STRONG IN THE LORD and in the strength of his might ... Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness" (EPHESIANS 6:10, 14).

These are powerful words. Paul's tone is like a great military leader addressing professionally trained warriors before a battle. The apostle knows the situation is desperate. Satan is the father of lies. Satan wants you to think you're broken and defeated. Just quit! Give up! Surrender!

Our text reminds us that we have the belt of truth — the truth of God's Word that is a belt that holds all the armor of God together. God who cannot lie has promised us eternal life. God who cannot lie gives us His breastplate of righteousness. We are washed in the blood of Christ! He won the victory on the cross. Christ destroyed sin, death and the power of the devil. The battle is won, the strife is over! God imputes His righteousness to us, and we are His redeemed children. That is the truth!

This passionate text has an urgency to it, as it calls us to be strong in the Lord and in His might. We have the truth of God's Word; we wear the breastplate of His righteousness. We aren't supposed to stand around, meandering leisurely with friends while taking in some restful scene. No! This is spiritual warfare with a deadly, cunning enemy. We have the life-giving Gospel truth and we need to proclaim it.

This is a desperate battle for our men and women of the armed forces. These brave men and women stand firm against the enemies of our nation and defend the freedoms we hold dear. They, along with their families, need your support to receive what they need to be strong, to stand firm in the truth of their faith. LCMS Ministry to the Armed Forces continues to provide them with the Gospel-centered resources they need to be spiritually fit for battle.
