- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. Readings for the Seventh Sunday after Pentecost

The Old Testament Reading is Isaiah 55:10-13

"For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth. making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty. but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it. For you shall go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and the hills before you shall break forth into singing, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands. Instead of the thorn shall come up the cypress: instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle; and it shall make a name for the LORD, an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off."

The Epistle is Romans 8:12-17

So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

The Gospel is Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. And great crowds gathered about him, so that he got into a boat and sat down. And the whole crowd stood on the beach. And he told them many things in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell along the path, and the birds came and devoured them. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much

soil, and immediately they sprang up, since they had no depth of soil, but when the sun rose they were scorched. And since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and produced grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. He who has ears, let him hear." ...

"Hear then the parable of the sower: When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. This is what was sown along the path. As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy, yet he has no root in himself, but endures for a while, and when tribulation or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately he falls away. As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful. As for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it. He indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty."

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Believers Enduring, Deeply Rooted in Christ

We saw many people join our cause in the beginning with great enthusiasm and joy; they esteemed the Gospel so highly. But they have become idle spirits like those of whom Christ speaks in Matt. 13:21. They have encountered no combat and strife; they have remained without experience. They resemble the seed that did not take root but was withered by the heat. They remained without fruit; and finally they fell away from us, as rotten, worm-eaten, and spoiled fruit falls from the trees.

"Anyone who is deeply rooted and well grounded will often imagine that he has neither God nor Christ. He will feel nothing but death, the devil, and sin passing over him like a violent storm and dark cloud. But at such times he will not be forsaken, as it seems. I will not remain away but will return to you and send you such light that you will be able to see Me better and more clearly than before. Yes, the more you suffer and show your love for Me, the more I will manifest Myself to you and demonstrate the greatness of the Father's and My love toward you."

Thus this is a sermon not only of words but of experience as well. To be sure, Christ begins with the Word, when He lets us hear the Gospel and receive Baptism and the Sacrament. But the devil comes on the heels of this; he assails and hinders us on all sides, in an attempt to check and obstruct the Word. At this point experience must enter in and enable a Christian to say: "Hitherto I have heard that Christ is my Savior, who conquered sin and death; and I believed this. Now my experience bears this out. For I was often in the agony of death and in the bonds of the devil, but He rescued me and manifested Himself. Now I see and know that He loves me and that what I believe is true."
