Readings for the Fifth Sunday after Pentecost

The Old Testament Reading is Jeremiah 28:5-9

Then the prophet Jeremiah spoke to Hananiah the prophet in the presence of the priests and all the people who were standing in the house of the LORD, and the prophet Jeremiah said, "Amen! May the LORD do so; may the LORD make the words that you have prophesied come true, and bring back to this place from Babylon the vessels of the house of the LORD, and all the exiles. Yet hear now this word that I speak in your hearing and in the hearing of all the people. The prophets who preceded you and me from ancient times prophesied war, famine, and pestilence against many countries and great kingdoms. As for the prophet who prophesies peace, when the word of that prophet comes to pass, then it will be known that the LORD has truly sent the prophet."

The Epistle is Romans 7:1-13

Do you not know, brothers—for I am speaking to those who know the law—that the law is binding on a person only as long as he lives? For a married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband dies she is released from the law of marriage. Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she lives with another man while her husband is alive. But if her husband dies, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress.

Likewise, my brothers, you also have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear fruit for God. For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our members to bear fruit for death. But now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us captive, so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit and not in the old way of the written code.

What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the law, I would not have known sin. For I would not have known what it is to covet if the law had not said, "You shall not covet." But sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. For apart from the law, sin lies dead. I was once alive apart from the law, but when the commandment came, sin came alive and I died. The very commandment that promised life proved to be death to me. For sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and

through it killed me. So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

Did that which is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, producing death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure.

The Gospel is Matthew 10:34-42

[Jesus said,] "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law. And a person's enemies will be those of his own household. Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

"Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives him who sent me. The one who receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and the one who receives a righteous person because he is a righteous person will receive a righteous person's reward. And whoever gives one of these little ones even a cup of cold water because he is a disciple, truly, I say to you, he will by no means lose his reward."



What Doctor Luther Says:

About Courage in the Fight against the Devil

Christians are not to become frightened or to fall away from Christ because [our life, government, order, and peace are shattered on account of Christ]. Rather let us take comfort and be strengthened by it, for it is not an evil sign. It is actually the true mark of the kingdom of Christ. The devil becomes angry, starts an uproar, and incites and drives the world to rage and storm wherever the preaching takes root that Christ alone is Lord and Savior, with the result that people are persecuted and murdered with sword, fire, and water for no other reason except that they confess and obey this Lord.

Nor is the devil to be misunderstood about this. He does not like it when his power and dominion are weakened, when he must stand for having "a stronger than he come upon him," as Christ says in Luke 11:22, "and take away from him his whole armor." This sort of thing cannot happen peaceably, without tumult and disturbance. So the devil blusters and turns everything topsy-turvy and defends himself as long as he can. And when he can no longer do this, he still yells about disobedience and rebellion. But this is the way it should be. For Christ is Lord; and He also came for the purpose, as Scripture has it (1 John 3:8), of destroying the kingdom of the devil. For the same reason He also says Himself (Matt. 10:34-36): "Do not think that I have come to bring peace on earth; I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother," ... The jurists and others wise in secular matters have a phrase: "Let justice be done, even though the world perishes on account of it." Ought this not to be said with far greater emphasis regarding these high and heavenly matters? Thus Christ's kingdom and obedience to Him are to be maintained, even though all the world crashes to the ground on this account, as it ultimately will. Luther's Works, 13:278-9.

Pastor Punke led the elders in a devotion by reading from Luther's Large Catechism on Holy Communion.

Pastor Punke presented his monthly report to the elders, providing information about members, about his activities, and about associations that have a relation to the church (LSUS and CLHS).

The elders spent the majority of the time by beginning a review of the goals assigned to the Council of Elders by the Ministry Clarity team. The three goals are the following:

One year after the Dobbs decision, new polling [from Tarrance Group] reveals that Americans overwhelmingly agree with pro-life protections for unborn babies and mothers and reject abortion extremism ... While much of the coverage on the issue of abortion in the year since the Dobbs decision portrays an America deeply divided, this survey shows that a supermajority (70% or above) of voters agree on a few key areas surrounding the issue ... Three-fourths of all voters are opposed to abortion throughout all nine months of pregnancy ... 77% support at least some prohibition to abortion, with exceptions for the life of the mother, rape, and incest. Only 15% "allowed [abortion] throughout all nine months of pregnancy, without any restrictions" ... Three-fourths (76%) support pregnancy resource centers that do not perform abortions but instead offer support to people during their pregnancy and after a baby is born ... SBA Pro-Life America President Marjorie Dannenfelser commented on the poll to LifeNews: "When it comes to protecting life and supporting women, Americans agree far more than the media will report ... We believe parents have a right to know if their daughters are considering abortion. And we believe women deserve all the compassion, support, and resources the pro-life safety net provides to genuinely empower them - not to be sold an abortion and sent off to figure out how to cope on their own." 
