RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those: (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;

- (b) who have been **instructed** in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been **confirmed** in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;

(d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

The liturgy for the first day of Holy Week is in two parts. It begins with a procession with palms as a dramatic prelude to the Eucharist; this memorable ceremony gives the nickname "Palm Sunday" to the day. The service itself is a celebration of the Passion of Jesus Christ, a highlight of which is the reading (or singing) of a passion account from one of the Gospels. As a prelude to the reading of the passion, the procession with palms provides of an appropriate outburst of joy which does not lose sight of the solemn goal of Jesus' triumphal entry: He rides on to die. The somberness of the passion, which is the focus of Holy Week, is thus framed by the joy of the preparatory procession and by the greater joy of Easter, which is its purpose and culmination.


A Reading from the Evangelist, St. John, the Twelfth Chapter.

The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."



Sermon

[Rise] + The Office of Confession of Sins and Holy Absolution +

Having heard the Word of God, and as we prepare for the great gift of the Holy Sacrament of Christ's body and blood, let us confess our sins and receive God's forgiveness. [Kneel]

O almighty God, merciful Father, I, a poor, miserable sinner, confess unto You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your temporal and eternal punishment. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray You of Your boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy,

innocent, bitter sufferings and death of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor, sinful being.

Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!

[Rise] Confession of Faith (The Nicene Creed)

Readings for Palm Sunday

The Old Testament Reading is Zechariah 9:9-12

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war horse from Jerusalem: and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall speak peace to the nations; his rule shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit. Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double.

The Epistle is Philippians 2:5-11

Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The Passion of Our Lord according to St. Mark Chapters 14-15 English Standard Version

1. The Plot to Kill Jesus (14:1–2)

- EVANGELIST: It was now two days before the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread. And the chief priests and the scribes were seeking how to arrest him by stealth and kill him, for they said,
- Chief Priests and Scribes: "Not during the feast, lest there be an uproar from the people."

2. Jesus Anointed at Bethany (14:3–9)

EVANGELIST: And while he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he was reclining at table, a woman came with an alabaster flask of ointment of pure nard, very costly, and she broke the flask and poured it over his head. There were some who said to themselves indignantly,

Disciples: "Why was the ointment wasted like that? For this ointment could have been sold for more than three hundred denarii and given to the poor."

EVANGELIST: And they scolded her. But Jesus said,

Jesus: "Leave her alone. Why do you trouble her? She has done a beautiful thing to me. For you always have the poor with you, and whenever you want, you can do good for them. But you will not always have me. She has done what she could; she has anointed my body beforehand for burial. And truly, I say to you, wherever the gospel is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in memory of her."

3. Judas to Betray Jesus (14:10–11)

EVANGELIST: Then Judas Iscariot, who was one of the twelve, went to the chief priests in order to betray him to them. And when they heard it, they were glad and promised to give him money. And he sought an opportunity to betray him.

4. The Passover with the Disciples (14:12–21)

EVANGELIST: And on the first day of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, his disciples said to him,

Disciples: "Where will you have us go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

EVANGELIST: And he sent two of his disciples and said to them,

- *Jesus*: "Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him, and wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' And he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready; there prepare for us."
- EVANGELIST: And the disciples set out and went to the city and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.
- EVANGELIST: And when it was evening, he came with the twelve. And as they were reclining at table and eating, Jesus said,

Jesus: "Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me, one who is eating with me."

EVANGELIST: They began to be sorrowful and to say to him one after another,

Disciples: "Is it I?"

EVANGELIST: He said to them,

Jesus: "It is one of the twelve, one who is dipping bread into the dish with me. For the Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born."

5. Jesus Institutes the Lord's Supper (14:22-25)

EVANGELIST: And as they were eating, he took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to them, and said,

Jesus: "Take; this is my body."

- EVANGELIST: And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, and they all drank of it. And he said to them,
- *Jesus*: "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly, I say to you, I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

6. Jesus Foretells Peter's Denial (14:26-31)

- EVANGELIST: And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. And Jesus said to them,
- *Jesus*: "You will all fall away, for it is written, 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered.' But after I am raised up, I will go before you to Galilee."

EVANGELIST: Peter said to him,

Peter: "Even though they all fall away, I will not."

EVANGELIST: And Jesus said to him,

Jesus: "Truly, I tell you, this very night, before the rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times."

EVANGELIST: But he said emphatically,

Peter: "If I must die with you, I will not deny you."

EVANGELIST: And they all said the same.

7. Jesus Prays in Gethsemane (14:32-42)

- EVANGELIST: And they went to a place called Gethsemane. And he said to his disciples,
- Jesus: "Sit here while I pray."
- EVANGELIST: And he took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be greatly distressed and troubled. And he said to them,

Jesus: "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death. Remain here and watch."

- EVANGELIST: And going a little farther, he fell on the ground and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. And he said,
- *Jesus*: "Abba, Father, all things are possible for you. Remove this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will."
- EVANGELIST: And he came and found them sleeping, and he said to Peter,
- *Jesus*: "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not watch one hour? Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."
- EVANGELIST: And again he went away and prayed, saying the same words. And again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were very heavy, and they did not know what to answer him. And he came the third time and said to them,
- *Jesus*: "Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? It is enough; the hour has come. The Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Rise, let us be going; see, my betrayer is at hand."

8. Jesus Is Betrayed and Arrested (14:43–49)

- EVANGELIST: And immediately, while he was still speaking, Judas came, one of the twelve, and with him a crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests and the scribes and the elders. Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying,
- Judas: "The one I will kiss is the man. Seize him and lead him away under guard."

EVANGELIST: And when he came, he went up to him at once and said,

Judas: "Rabbi!"

- EVANGELIST: And he kissed him. And they laid hands on him and seized him. But one of those who stood by drew his sword and struck the servant of the high priest and cut off his ear. And Jesus said to them,
- *Jesus*: "Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs to capture me? Day after day I was with you in the temple teaching, and you did not seize me. But let the Scriptures be fulfilled."

9. The Disciples Flee (14:50–52)

EVANGELIST: And they all left him and fled. And a young man followed him, with nothing but a linen cloth about his body. And they seized him, but he left the linen cloth and ran away naked.

10. Jesus Before the Council (14:53-65)

- EvangeLIST: And they led Jesus to the high priest. And all the chief priests and the elders and the scribes came together. And Peter had followed him at a distance, right into the courtyard of the high priest. And he was sitting with the guards and warming himself at the fire. Now the chief priests and the whole Council were seeking testimony against Jesus to put him to death, but they found none. For many bore false witness against him, but their testimony did not agree. And some stood up and bore false witness against him, saying,
- False Witnesses: "We heard him say, 'I will destroy this temple that is made with hands, and in three days I will build another, not made with hands."
- EVANGELIST: Yet even about this their testimony did not agree. And the high priest stood up in the midst and asked Jesus,
- High Priest: "Have you no answer to make? What is it that these men testify against you?"
- EVANGELIST: But he remained silent and made no answer. Again the high priest asked him,

High Priest: "Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?"

EVANGELIST: And Jesus said,

- *Jesus*: "I am, and you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of Power, and coming with the clouds of heaven."
- EVANGELIST: And the high priest tore his garments and said,
- High Priest: "What further witnesses do we need? You have heard his blasphemy. What is your decision?"
- EVANGELIST: And they all condemned him as deserving death. And some began to spit on him and to cover his face and to strike him, saying to him,

Elders: "Prophesy!"

EVANGELIST: And the guards received him with blows.

11. Peter Denies Jesus (14:66-72)

EVANGELIST: And as Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the servant girls of the high priest came, and seeing Peter warming himself, she looked at him and said,

Servant Girl: "You also were with the Nazarene, Jesus."

EVANGELIST: But he denied it, saying,

Peter: "I neither know nor understand what you mean."

EVANGELIST: And he went out into the gateway and the rooster crowed. And the servant girl saw him and began again to say to the bystanders,

Servant Girl: "This man is one of them."

EVANGELIST: But again he denied it. And after a little while the bystanders again said to Peter,

Bystander: "Certainly you are one of them, for you are a Galilean."

EVANGELIST: But he began to invoke a curse on himself and to swear,

Peter: "I do not know this man of whom you speak."

- EVANGELIST: And immediately the rooster crowed a second time. And Peter remembered how Jesus had said to him,
- Jesus: "Before the rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times."

EVANGELIST: And he broke down and wept.

12. Jesus Delivered to Pilate (15:1-5)

EVANGELIST: And as soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole Council. And they bound Jesus and led him away and delivered him over to Pilate. And Pilate asked him,

Pilate: "Are you the King of the Jews?"

EVANGELIST: And he answered him,

Jesus: "You have said so."

EVANGELIST: And the chief priests accused him of many things. And Pilate again asked him,

Pilate "Have you no answer to make? See how many charges they bring against you."

EVANGELIST: But Jesus made no further answer, so that Pilate was amazed.

13. Pilate Delivers Jesus to Be Crucified (15:6-15)

EvangeLIST: Now at the feast he used to release for them one prisoner for whom they asked. And among the rebels in prison, who had committed murder in the insurrection, there was a man called Barabbas. And the crowd came up and began to ask Pilate to do as he usually did for them. And he answered them, saying,

Pilate: "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?"

EVANGELIST: For he perceived that it was out of envy that the chief priests had delivered him up. But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release for them Barabbas instead. And Pilate again said to them,

Pilate: "Then what shall I do with the man you call the King of the Jews?"

EVANGELIST: And they cried out again,

Crowd: "Crucify him."

EVANGELIST: And Pilate said to them,

Pilate: "Why, what evil has he done?"

EVANGELIST: But they shouted all the more,

Crowd: "Crucify him."

EVANGELIST: So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified.

14. Jesus Is Mocked (15:16-20)

EVANGELIST: And the soldiers led him away inside the palace (that is, the governor's headquarters), and they called together the whole battalion. And they clothed him in a purple cloak, and twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on him. And they began to salute him,

Soldiers: "Hail, King of the Jews!"

EVANGELIST: And they were striking his head with a reed and spitting on him and kneeling down in homage to him. And when they had mocked him, they stripped

him of the purple cloak and put his own clothes on him. And they led him out to crucify him.

15. Jesus is Crucified (15:21-32)

- EvangeLIST: And they compelled a passerby, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross. And they brought him to the place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull). And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he did not take it. And they crucified him and divided his garments among them, casting lots for them, to decide what each should take. And it was the third hour when they crucified him. And the inscription of the charge against him read, "The King of the Jews." And with him they crucified two robbers, one on his right and one on his left. And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads and saying,
- Passersby: "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save yourself, and come down from the cross!"
- EVANGELIST: So also the chief priests with the scribes mocked him to one another, saying,
- Chief Priests and Scribes: "He saved others; he cannot save himself. Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross that we may see and believe."

EVANGELIST: Those who were crucified with him also reviled him.

16. Jesus Dies (15:33-41)

- EVANGELIST: And when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice,
- Jesus: "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?"
- EVANGELIST: which means,
- Jesus: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"
- EVANGELIST: And some of the bystanders hearing it said,

Bystanders: "Behold, he is calling Elijah."

EVANGELIST: And someone ran and filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a reed and gave it to him to drink, saying,

Bystander: "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down."

EVANGELIST: And Jesus uttered a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said,

Centurion: "Truly this man was the Son of God!"

EvangeLIST: There were also women looking on from a distance, among whom were Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and Salome. When he was in Galilee, they followed him and ministered to him, and there were also many other women who came up with him to Jerusalem.

17. Jesus Is Buried (15:42-47)

EvangeLIST: And when evening had come, since it was the day of Preparation, that is, the day before the Sabbath, Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the Council, who was also himself looking for the kingdom of God, took courage and went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Pilate was surprised to hear that he should have already died. And summoning the centurion, he asked him whether he was already dead. And when he learned from the centurion that he was dead, he granted the corpse to Joseph. And Joseph bought a linen shroud, and taking him down, wrapped him in the linen shroud and laid him in a tomb that had been cut out of the rock. And he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb. Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses saw where he was laid.

The Resurrection of Our Lord 1 Corinthians 15:1-11



What Doctor Luther Says:

About the King who Sets Captives Free by His Blood 11. You also, because of the blood of Your covenant, set Your captives free from the waterless pit.

[Zechariah] has just said that the dominion of this King shall not consist in external worldly splendor but in poverty, and that He shall nevertheless bring justice and salvation to His people and shall also establish peace among the Gentiles ... by establishing peace between God and us, Rom. 5:1. If one should ask how He will accomplish all these things ..., He gives the answer here and now and says: "Because of the blood of Your covenant, or testament, etc." And He holds up this blood against the blood of the Old Testament, and thereby He also abolishes the latter. It is as though He would say: "Moses led his people out of Egypt through the blood of his testament; but You, the new King, will institute a new testament and abolish the former through the blood of Your own testament; and through it You will not lead the people of Israel out of Egypt but Your own captives out of another Egypt, out of the waterless pit. And that is the power through which You will bring about that righteousness and salvation and peace — not with sword and armor but through Your suffering, blood, and death."

Thus this text tells us, first, that this King shall die and shed His blood in order to gain for His people righteousness, salvation, and peace —that is, forgiveness of sins and eternal life; second, that He shall rise again from death and live eternally; and then there follows that He will expand this testament by means of the Gospel and rule His people, as we shall hear. This no dead man can do. Therefore we have the statement "that it was necessary that the Christ should suffer and rise and thus enter into His glory," as Luke 24:26 describes it. *Luther's Works*, 20:289-90.

Summary of meeting of the Council of Elders, March 7, 2024 (The following summary is being provided in accordance with the congregation's bylaws, VIII)

Attendance: Elders present: R. Lammert (chairman), A. Litke (secretary), F. Jackson, W. Krause, T. Muehl, B. Scott. Elder absent: K. Vlot. Pastor present: Pr. Punke.

Pastor Punke led the elders in a devotion by reading Article IV from the Augsburg Confession as well as the response from the Roman Confutation.

In his pastor's report, Pastor Punke reported on matters of health and other issues of members and friends of Zion, as well as items of interest from LSUS and CLHS. He noted, as he had done at the congregational meeting, that the SPZP (Saint Peter Zion Project) was coming to an end.

The elders considered Pillar 1, Goal #1: "Starting January 1, 2024, Zion will experience a 10% increase in average worship attendance by March 31, 2024." In the church directory, Melvia Culpher has marked members as "inactive" if they have not attended since before the time of COVID-19. The elders will review an example of a letter that Art Litke has used in the past to contact inactive members, and will update it for use at Zion.

The elders reviewed progress on Pillar 2, Goal #1: "In January, 2024, Zion will commence an annual opportunity for providing resources and training for members to gain confidence in inviting neighbors to Zion." The "Every One His Witness" workshop ended on February 13 with seven members completing it. Having successfully met this goal, the elders will offer another set of sessions of the workshop in the fall of 2024 (probably beginning in September).

The elders reviewed Pillar 2, Goal #3: "Starting October 1, Zion will have a quarterly non-Communion worship service (elders determine strategies, timetable, location, etc.)." The elders

reported to a meeting of the Ministry Clarity team on February 20 that they had concluded that the goal could not be accomplished without changing the nature of the congregation. The chairman of the Ministry Clarity team said that the elders had done what they were supposed to do in examining the goal, and had clarified the ministry of Zion by concluding that this goal did not align with Zion's ministry. The elders have accordingly marked the goal as closed.

The elders added a new goal to the Aspirational Targets of the Ministry Clarity team. The goal is Pillar 2, Goal #4: "Together with other congregational leaders, the elders will decide whether or not Zion will use the synodical program 're:Vitality.'" The elders viewed an informational video on the program, and will work with the elders and ushers to become similarly informed about the program. Next month, the elders will view a video about the first part of the program, a self-assessment tool to analyze the strengths and weaknesses of the congregation. In contrast to "Every One His Witness," which focuses on witnessing by individual members of the congregation, the "re:Vitality" program focuses on sharing the Gospel with the community through effective congregational outreach.

Frank Jackson reported that he is working on finalizing the location and the installation of the two purchased AEDs. He is also working with Amber Bahr to see if Michael Cullen, a teacher at LSUS, can train Zion's ushers, elders, and other interested individuals.

The meeting was concluded with the praying of Compline


