RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION



- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. 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Readings for the Second Sunday of Easter

The First Reading is Acts 5:12-32

Now many signs and wonders were regularly done among the people by the hands of the apostles. And they were all together in Solomon's Portico. None of the rest dared join them, but the people held them in high esteem. And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes of both men and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets and laid them on cots and mats, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them. The people also gathered from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all healed.

But the high priest rose up, and all who were with him (that is, the party of the Sadducees), and filled with jealousy they arrested the apostles and put them in the public prison. But during the night an angel of the Lord opened the prison doors and brought them out, and said, "Go and stand in the temple and speak to the people all the words of this Life." And when they heard this, they entered the temple at daybreak and began to teach.

Now when the high priest came, and those who were with him, they called together the council and all the senate of Israel and sent to the prison to have them brought. But when the officers came, they did not find them in the prison, so they returned and reported, "We found the prison securely locked and the guards standing at the doors, but when we opened them we found no one inside." Now when the captain of the temple and the chief priests heard these words, they were greatly perplexed about them, wondering what this would come to. And someone came and told them, "Look! The men whom you put in prison are standing in the temple and teaching the people." Then the captain with the officers went and brought them, but not by force, for they were afraid of being stoned by the people.

And when they had brought them, they set them before the council. And the high priest questioned them, saying, "We strictly charged you not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and you intend to bring this man's blood upon us." But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than men. The God of our fathers raised Jesus, whom you killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior, to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him."

The Epistle is Revelation 1:4-18

John to the seven churches that are in Asia:

Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth.

To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood and made us a kingdom, priests to his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. Behold, he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him, and all tribes of the earth will wail on account of him. Even so. Amen.

"I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."

I, John, your brother and partner in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos on account of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet saying, "Write what you see in a book and send it to the seven churches, to Ephesus and to Smyrna and to Pergamum and to Thyatira and to Sardis and to Philadelphia and to Laodicea."

Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest. The hairs of his head were white like wool, as white as snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, his feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and his voice was like the roar of many waters. In his right hand he held seven stars, from his mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and his face was like the sun shining in full strength.

When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades."

The Gospel is John 20:19-31

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld."

Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.



What Doctor Luther Says:

About Faithful Preaching in the Face of Opposition Both Jews and Gentiles attributed such disturbances of the public peace [namely, "endless troubles, seditions, scandals, and sects (that) have arisen"] to the teaching of Paul and the other apostles; and so they persecuted them as enemies of the public peace and of religion.

Nevertheless, the apostles did not desert their ministry on this account but carried it out vigorously, preaching and confessing Christ. For they knew that they had to obey God rather than men (Acts 5:29) and that it was better for the entire universe to be thrown into tumult and contention than for Christ not to be preached or for even one soul to perish.

Meanwhile, however, these offenses could not help causing great sorrow to the apostles; ... They saw that great upheavals and universal revolutions would follow this doctrine of theirs, and that endless sects were arising while they were still alive — something that was bitterer for them than death, especially for Paul. It was a sad message for Paul when he heard that the Corinthians denied the resurrection of the dead (1 Cor. 15:12), to say nothing of anything else, or when he heard that the churches founded by his ministry were being disturbed, that the Gospel was being overthrown by the false apostles, and that all Asia and other great men besides had turned away from him (2 Tim. 1:15). But he knew that his teaching was not the cause of these scandals and sects. Therefore he did not lose heart and did not forsake his calling but went right ahead; he knew that the Gospel he preached was "the power of God for salvation to everyone who had faith" (Rom. 1:16), regardless of how foolish and offensive a doctrine it seemed to be to Gentiles and Jews. He knew that those who were not offended by this Word of the cross were blessed, whether they were preachers or hearers, as Christ also says (Matt. 11:6): "Blessed is he who takes no offense at Me." Luther's Works, 26:426-27.

Summary of meeting of the Council of Elders, April 3, 2025 (The following summary is being provided in accordance with the congregation's bylaws, §VIII)

Attendance: Elders present: R. Lammert (chairman), A. Litke (secretary), F. Jackson, W. Krause, J. Teasdale, K. Vlot. Elders absent: T. Muehl. Pastor present: Pr. Punke.

Pastor Punke led the elders in a devotion by continuing the reading Article V of the Apology of the Augsburg Confession.

In his pastor's report, Pastor Punke reported on deaths among the members and friends of Zion, on membership transfers to and from Zion, on health and other issues of members, on adult catechesis, on calls he has made to inactive members, on Holy Week/Easter worship, on the beautification project, on property issues as a result of the lightning strike the day before the meeting, on LSUS, and on CLHS's capital campaign.

The elders reviewed Pillar 1, Goal #1: "Starting April 1, 2025, Zion will experience a 10% increase in average worship attendance by June 30, 2025." Pastor Punke included information on calls he had made on inactive members in his report. The elders will pursue this goal starting in its May meeting by developing strategies for contacting longer-term inactive members and ways to involve them again in the congregation.

The elders reviewed Pillar 2, Goal #1: "In January of 2025, Zion will commence an annual opportunity for providing resources and training for members to gain confidence in inviting neighbors to Zion." This goal is currently on hold; the elders will schedule another *Every One His Witness* workshop for the fall.

The elders reviewed Pillar 2, Goal #4: "The Council of Elders will conduct the CADDS survey before Easter 2025." The Congregational Assessment of Development/Decline Status (CADDS) survey will run from April 13 through May 4. The survey is a tool developed by The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod to survey congregational members and others who have a stake in the congregation. Congregational members are encouraged to respond to the survey online, using the QR code or clickable URL link found in the bulletin and church mailings. Anyone who is unable or unwilling to use an online form should contact the church office before May 4 for a printed form that can be used to complete the survey.

Art Litke reported that Richard Schwantz had agreed to become a member of the Pastoral Support and Assistance Committee; the elders approved of Schwantz as a new member. The committee will meet sometime after Easter to prepare its recommendations for salaries for the church staff.

The meeting was concluded with the praying of Responsive Prayer 1.


