- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;

(d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. Readings for the Festival of Saints Peter and Paul

The First Reading is Acts 15:1-12

But some men came down from Judea and were teaching the brothers, "Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses, you cannot be saved." And after Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and debate with them, Paul and Barnabas and some of the others were appointed to go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and the elders about this question. So, being sent on their way by the church, they passed through both Phoenicia and Samaria, describing in detail the conversion of the Gentiles, and brought great joy to all the brothers. When they came to Jerusalem, they were welcomed by the church and the apostles and the elders, and they declared all that God had done with them. But some believers who belonged to the party of the Pharisees rose up and said, "It is necessary to circumcise them and to order them to keep the law of Moses."

The apostles and the elders were gathered together to consider this matter. And after there had been much debate, Peter stood up and said to them, "Brothers, you know that in the early days God made a choice among you, that by my mouth the Gentiles should hear the word of the gospel and believe. And God, who knows the heart, bore witness to them, by giving them the Holy Spirit just as he did to us, and he made no distinction between us and them, having cleansed their hearts by faith. Now, therefore, why are you putting God to the test by placing a yoke on the neck of the disciples that neither our fathers nor we have been able to bear? But we believe that we will be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus, just as they will."

And all the assembly fell silent, and they listened to Barnabas and Paul as they related what signs and wonders God had done through them among the Gentiles.

The Epistle is Galatians 2:1-10

Then after fourteen years I went up again to Jerusalem with Barnabas, taking Titus along with me. I went up because of a revelation and set before them (though privately before those who seemed influential) the gospel that I proclaim among the Gentiles, in order to make sure I was not running or had not run in vain. But even Titus, who was with me, was not forced to be circumcised, though he was a Greek. Yet because of false brothers secretly brought in—who slipped in to spy out our freedom that we have in Christ Jesus, so that they might bring us into slavery— to them we did not yield in submission even for a moment, so that the truth of the gospel might be preserved for you. And from those who seemed to be influential (what they were makes no difference to me; God shows no partiality)—those, I say, who seemed influential added nothing to me. On the contrary, when they saw that I had been entrusted with the gospel to the uncircumcised, just as Peter had been entrusted with the gospel to the circumcised (for he who worked through Peter for his apostolic ministry to the circumcised worked also through me for mine to the Gentiles), and when James and Cephas and John, who seemed to be pillars, perceived the grace that was given to me, they gave the right hand of fellowship to Barnabas and me, that we should go to the Gentiles and they to the circumcised. Only, they asked us to remember the poor, the very thing I was eager to do.

The Gospel is Matthew 16:13-19

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Being Purified through Faith, Not by the Law The Law – not only the Ceremonial Law but also the Moral Law, indeed, even the most sacred Decalog which contains God's eternal commandments

even the most sacred Decalog, which contains God's eternal commandments ... neither gives life nor justifies but kills and causes sin to abound. For no matter how much the Law is taught or observed, it does not purify the heart itself. But if the heart has not been purified, what else are good works, whether ceremonial or moral, but hypocrisy and the outward appearance of piety? Thus Christ says that the Pharisees look fine on the outside but are full of filth inside (Matt. 23:27). The result is that even though a person does not steal or commit adultery in the outward act, nevertheless he is either inwardly inclined toward those very deeds or abstains from them out of love for his own advantage or out of fear of punishment. ... There is nothing, therefore, that sets one free from this impurity of the heart except faith, as is stated in Acts 15:9: "Purifying their hearts by faith," in order that in this way Paul's statement in Titus 1:15 may stand: "To the pure all things are pure, but to the corrupt and unbelieving nothing is pure." According to the same rule, he says in Rom. 2:21; "You who teach that one must not steal, do you steal?" ...

Therefore unless the doctrine of faith, by which the heart is purified and justified, is revealed, all instruction in all commandments is a matter of the letter and a tradition of the fathers. For the commandment teaches what must be done. Since this could not be done, the doctrine of faith (that is, the Gospel) teaches how it becomes possible. For this doctrine teaches one to flee for refuge to the grace of God and to implore God Himself as the Teacher and Doctor to write into our hearts with the finger of His Spirit His own living, shining, and glowing letters, in order that we may be enlightened and inflamed by them and cry out: "Abba, Father!" (Gal. 4:6.) And this is not instruction of the fathers; it is divine instruction. *Luther's Works*, 27:188-89.
