RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

Readings for the Feast of the Nativity of our Lord

The Old Testament Reading is Isaiah 52:7-10

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news. who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness. who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." The voice of your watchmen—they lift up their voice:

together they sing for joy;

for eve to eve they see the return of the LORD to Zion. Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the LORD has comforted his people;

he has redeemed Jerusalem.

The LORD has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God

The Epistle is Hebrews 1:1-12

Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

For to which of the angels did God ever say. "You are my Son,

today I have begotten you"?

Or again,

"I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son"?

And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says, "Let all God's angels worship him."

Of the angels he says, "He makes his angels winds, and his ministers a flame of fire."

But of the Son he says,

"Your throne, O God, is forever and ever, the scepter of uprightness is the scepter of your kingdom. You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of gladness beyond your companions."

And,

"You, Lord, laid the foundation of the earth in the beginning, and the heavens are the work of your hands; they will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like a garment, like a robe you will roll them up, like a garment they will be changed.

But you are the same, and your years will have no end."

The Gospel is John 1:1-18

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John bore witness about him, and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, because he was before me.'") For from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only God, who is at the Father's side, he has made him known.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Leaving the Beauty and Kingdom to Christ

"Beauty" is every adornment in a person because of which he is honored and glorified. Therefore, when glory is without beauty, it is empty. But in Christ alone there is beauty. Therefore outside of Christ all glory is empty. He has "clothed Himself with beauty" (Ps. 93:1) and "is crowned with glory and honor" (Ps. 8:5). But it behooves us to be clothed with disgrace instead of glory, shame instead of honor, ugliness instead of beauty.

Hence, when the psalm says, "The Lord reigns, he is clothed with beauty" (Ps. 93:1), what do you think is being said to you, except that you leave the beauty and the kingdom to Him and put on ugliness and become a servant, and instead of the honor of dominion you be mindful of the shame of your most wretched slavery? Again, when he says, Ps. 45:3, "with Thy comeliness and Thy beauty, etc.," what else do you hear but that you should give to Christ the foreign beauty which you snatched prematurely, and walk and go down and withdraw in disgrace and shame? And so with similar matters.

Luther's Works, 11:387.

Beloved in Christ, You know the tender story of Christmas: Mary and Joseph make their way to Bethlehem to be registered for the census by Caesar Augustus. And while there Mary gives birth to her firstborn son amidst ox and ass and laid Him in a manger. They named this son Jesus as she and Joseph had been instructed. This is all true ... history. But knowing all this is not yet faith as Luther explains: "faith does not merely consist in believing that this story is true, as it is written. For that does not avail anything, because everyone, even the damned, believe that. Concerning faith, Scripture and God's word do not teach that it is a natural work, without grace. Rather the faith that is the right one, rich in grace, demanded by God's word and deed, is that you firmly believe Christ is born for you and that his birth is yours, and come to pass for your benefit. For the Gospel teaches that Christ was born for our sake and that he did everything and suffered all things for our sake, just as the angel says here: 'I announce to you a great joy which will come to all people; for to you is born this day a Savior who is Christ the Lord' [Luke 2:10-11]. From these words you see clearly that he was born for us. "He does not simply say: 'Christ is born,' but: 'for you is he born.' Again, he does not say: 'I announce a joy,' but: 'to you do I announce a great joy.' Again, this joy will not remain in Christ, but is for all people. ... "Christ has a pure, innocent, holy birth. Man has an impure, sinful, damned birth, as David says in Psalm 51[:5]: 'Behold, in sin am I fashioned in the womb, and in sin did my mother conceive me.' There is no remedy for this except through the pure birth of Christ. ... Christ takes to himself our birth and absorbs it in his birth; he presents us with his birth so that we become pure and new in it, as if it were our own, so that every Christian might rejoice in this birth of Christ and glory in it ..." (Luther's Works, 52:14-15). God grant us grace to find joy in the pure birth of Jesus Christ, God's Son, born for you. Zion's staff and I pray that you may live in the peace and hope that only Christ gives. God grant you also a blessed New Year. Glory to God in the highest! Yours in Christ, Parto Punte
