


Beloved in Christ, be it this Christmas Eve...





Lessons for the Eve of the Nativity of Our Lord

First Lesson Genesis 3:8-15

[The man and woman] heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. But the LORD God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" And he said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself." He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten of the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate." Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

The LORD God said to the serpent,
"Because you have done this,
cursed are you above all livestock
and above all beasts of the field;
on your belly you shall go,
and dust you shall eat
all the days of your life.
I will put enmity between you and the woman,
and between your offspring and her offspring;
he shall bruise your head,
and you shall bruise his heel."

Second Lesson Genesis 22:15-18

The angel of the LORD called to Abraham a second time from heaven and said, "By myself I have sworn, declares the LORD, because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, I will surely bless you, and I will surely multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore. And your offspring shall possess the gate of his enemies, and in your offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed, because you have obeyed my voice."

Third Lesson Isaiah 9:2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness,

on them has light shone.

You have multiplied the nation;

you have increased its joy;

they rejoice before you

as with joy at the harvest,

as they are glad when they divide the spoil.

For the yoke of his burden,

Fifth Lesson Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?"

And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God. And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her

Sixth Lesson Luke 2:1-20 (KJV)

And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus, that all the world should be taxed. (And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria.) And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judaea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:) To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child. And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.

And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, "Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men."

And it came to pass, as the angels were gone away from them into heaven, the shepherds said one to another, "Let us now go even unto Bethlehem, and see this thing which is come to pass, which the Lord hath made known unto us." And they came with haste, and found Mary, and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger. And when they had seen it, they made known abroad the saying which was told them concerning this child. And all they that heard it wondered at those things which were told them by the shepherds. But Mary kept all these things, and pondered them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told unto them.

Seventh Lesson John 1:1-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.



What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Holy, Blameless, Unstained Christ 26. [For it was fitting that we should have such a High Priest,] holy, blameless, unstained.

According to the usage of Scripture that which is clean and sacred to God is called "holy." On the other hand, that which is open to uses other than divine is called "profane." Therefore it is frequently recorded in the Law that the people and the priests are sanctified, likewise the temple, the tabernacle, the vestments, and the vessels. And in this way it connotes in a mystical manner the sanctification of the Spirit, by which they become a new creature. A person who is irreprehensible is called "blameless"; for a saint can use his sanctity in an improper manner, just as a Christian can use his Baptism and the newness of the spirit in an improper manner. Therefore "blamelessness" is the irreprehensible use and the work of the saint himself, so that "holy" points out the substance, and "blameless" points out the performance, as in Ps. 24:4: "He who has blameless hands (that is, irreprehensible in what he does) and a clean heart," that is, one who is holy. And Ps. 18:26 says: "With the blameless Thou shalt be blameless." Therefore Christ is "the blameless Lamb," that is, irreprehensible and unaccusable. This, as Isaiah and Peter say, means that "He committed no sin; no guile was found on His lips" (1 Peter 2:22; Is. 53:9). He who cannot be polluted by others either is called "untainted." For even if a priest of the Law were clean and irreprehensible so far as he himself was concerned, he could be polluted by something else if, for example, he were to touch a corpse or a leper. But just as Christ was free from uncleanness because no inner filth of His own made Him unclean, so He cannot be polluted by the filth of others either.

Beloved in Christ, You know the tender story of Christmas: Mary and Joseph make their way to Bethlehem to be registered for the census by Caesar Augustus. And while there Mary gives birth to her firstborn son amidst ox and ass and laid Him in a manger. They named this son Jesus as she and Joseph had been instructed. This is all true ... history. But knowing all this is not yet faith as Luther explains: "faith does not merely consist in believing that this story is true, as it is written. For that does not avail anything, because everyone, even the damned, believe that. Concerning faith, Scripture and God's word do not teach that it is a natural work, without grace. Rather the faith that is the right one, rich in grace, demanded by God's word and deed, is that you firmly believe Christ is born for you and that his birth is yours, and come to pass for your benefit. For the Gospel teaches that Christ was born for our sake and that he did everything and suffered all things for our sake, just as the angel says here: 'I announce to you a great joy which will come to all people; for to you is born this day a Savior who is Christ the Lord' [Luke 2:10-11]. From these words you see clearly that he was born for us. "He does not simply say: 'Christ is born,' but: 'for you is he born.' Again, he does not say: 'I announce a joy,' but: 'to you do I announce a great joy.' Again, this joy will not remain in Christ, but is for all people. ... "Christ has a pure, innocent, holy birth. Man has an impure, sinful, damned birth, as David says in Psalm 51[:5]: 'Behold, in sin am I fashioned in the womb, and in sin did my mother conceive me.'
